Neighborhood Updates from the Office of Councilmember Jay Schenirer

Happy spring! Over the past few months our office has had the pleasure of meeting with and talking to many Hollywood Park (and adjacent neighborhood) residents.

Here are updates on exciting projects happening in the area.

7-Eleven Project on 24th Street & Fruitridge: We've all seen the construction work stop and start and stop over the past two years. While there have been quite a few bumps and delays, the property owner has been working with city staff to make sure the project continues to move forward. This month, the concrete for the sidewalk has been poured and we are working with the City's project manager to improve pedestrian safety in the area until it is finished. Until then, we will be meeting with the property owner to ensure that things run as smoothly as possible. We are anxiously awaiting this project being completed!

Raley's: It's been a long time coming, but the new Raley's location is almost completed and we are excited! We look forward to the improved store (and restored signage) and other new stores on Freeport!

Get Involved: Have you been looking for a way to get involved? My office works closely with the Hollywood Park Neighbor-

hood Association and the Freeport Blvd. Transportation Safety Group. Neighborhood Associations and community groups play a strong role to inform the decisions we make for the city.

- This year, my office is looking to work more closely with these groups, from having discussions about important issues impacting the community, to planning summer events for everyone to enjoy!
- Hollywood Park & Leonardo da Vinci school grounds: A
 reminder that Hollywood Park Elementary and LdV gates
 are open during school start/end times only, but if there

- Mangan Park: For those of you who have friends in Mangan Park (on the south side of Fruitridge Blvd), we're hoping to start a neighborhood association in the immediate area. If you know of anyone who's interested, please reach out to our office.

Greetings from Sowing Solidarity, your Neighborhood Urban Farm!

As you may already know, Sowing Solidarity is a nonprofit urban farm located at the intersection of 23rd Street and Anita Avenue that leases 1/4 acre from St. Robert School.

In 2019, we operated a Saturday morning farm stand on site from April-September and all of our proceeds went towards global health initiatives. We sustainably farm the land and are 100% volunteers.



Last year we smashed our initial goal and sponsored the purchase of 7,000+ malaria nets for communities in the Democratic Republic of Congo.



This 2020 season we will let the public vote at the farm stand from three different international health initiatives to determine our cause for the year.

Like last year, any unsold food will be donated to River City Food Bank each week. We donated 1,100+ pounds of fresh produce last year. Stay tuned! Our first farm stand will likely take place in late April.

More Trees are Coming

The CommuniTree Committee has been busy for the past two years planting front yard trees in Hollywood Park. Many of our older trees are dying and need to be replaced.

Our winter project is having some of the stumps of these large trees ground out of residents' front yards free of charge. We will then plant new shade trees to replace the old trees.

This has been funded by a grant from our County Supervisor, Patrick Kennedy.

If you would like a shade tree, but don't know which variety, we have the answer to your dilemma. Join us in May for our annual Tree Bike Ride!



A forester from Sacramento Tree Foundation will guide us through the neighborhood identifying great shade tree choices. Families with children have really enjoyed this event. We will notify neighbors by email, Facebook and flyers when the date is determined.

We have had a dry winter so this is a reminder to water your young trees now. They are thirsty. Also, if you have mistletoe in a tree, this is the time to prune it out, before the tree blooms. We recommend contacting a licensed tree service. Remember, mistletoe is a parasite and will eventually kill your tree. Transportation Safety Committee Thrilled at City's Efforts to Improve Freeport Blvd.

As many of you may be aware, ever since a tragic accident took the life of a neighbor in 2018, the Freeport Blvd. Transportation Safety Committee has been actively exploring ways to change this thoroughfare to make it safe for all travelers. We are happy to report that, with the generous assistance of WalkSacramento, our efforts have helped the city put together a compelling grant application to study the safety of the corridor.

In September, the City Council officially voted to direct staff to seek grant funding from Caltrans to study, among other areas, the Freeport Blvd. commercial corridor from Sutterville Road to Blair Avenue and to develop a transportation plan focusing on safety, mobility and access along the corridor. Our group was able to provide a draft report from WalkSacramento describing the findings from a community walk audit along with our own findings from an online survey. In addition, we were able to gather more than 30 letters in support of the grant. The city expects to find out whether it will receive the grant sometime this spring.
